- 1 Medical Ethics for medical students is a two credit hours course to be delivered to the second year medical students. This course is structured to cover essential ethical biomedical issues through awareness of the values and principles that commonly apply to discussions on medical ethics, such as human dignity, informed consent and patient autonomy, confidentiality, and justice. Awareness of Physician's Auth, Duties, Right's and identity. Teaching and training on communication and decision-making skills in ethically and culturally problematic situations is one the expected outcomes in addition to keep medical students and future physicians familiar with ethical and professional guidelines and recommendations and relevant health care and medical legislation. The principles of evidence based medicine and research are currently included in this syllabus. This is give in two formats; one in Arabic and the other in English and By the end of this course the student will be able to:
