Course Contents

- 1 - Macroeconomic analysis addresses overall economic activity at the national level .
- 2 - Addresses the economic aggregates relating to economic processes: production and GDP, consumption, savings, investment, import and export, etc.
- 3 - It also addresses how to achieve a balance between these variables and the effects of imbalance balance on unemployment, inflation and currency exchange rates, especially on economic growth and standard of living.
- 4 - One of the important topics which occupy much of the macro-economic analysis, the economic role of the State, because the State is the single economic actor that handles matters at the level of the overall system, and has the means to intervene at this level, such as the adoption of fiscal and monetary policies, intervene at the level of totalitarian planning, planning or steering.
- 5 - Keynes school as the first liberal economists, who attributed the significant role of the State in dealing with the economic crisis.
