1 - This course includes a full description of the vocal apparatus including the ear, and its operation, the articulatory classification of sounds, stress, tone, and quantity. With this material, the student should be able to understand the phonetic situation within English and conduct his own phonemic analysis of any other language. Emphasis is to be focused on topics such as: production and analysis of speech, the syllable, voice quality and voice dynamics, assimilation and cardinal vowels.
