Course Objectives

- 1 - The aim of the course in novel 2 which is called also: The Victorian Novel or the Nineteenth century Novel, is to accustom students on reading and how to read between the lines, searching the hidden meaning and objective that lie behind the writer's aims. The course meant, too, to make easy for students to cope with the art of analyzing the depth of ideas and thought that lie behind the writer's quests.
- 2 - The course contains covering at least two or three novels connected to the Victorian period of English literature. The novels concentrate on the oppression that had been demonstrated on the Victorian people of the Queen Victoria.

Teaching and Learning Methods

- 1 - As usual, teaching literature depends much on theoretical system. The lecturer divides the course into sixteen academic weeks, where the chapters of each novel will be covered in a particular time, the period should be stretched to include at least twelve or thirteen weeks where two weeks are given to the mid-term exam and to the final. Teaching methods, no doubt, is theoretical and in the class too, where discussions, analysis and the change of ideas and views are for sure included.
